

A Note from Fr. Mike

We live in a world which, despite great advances in knowledge and technology, has forgotten its origin and destiny in the love of God. This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. We may wonder why we do this. There are a couple of reasons. The first is to understand the history of the discovery and recovery of the true cross. Secondly, to appreciate better the importance of the symbol and reality of Christ's sacrificial love, namely, the cross in the daily life of every Christian.

The original cross on which Jesus was crucified was excavated in 326 AD by a group led by St. Helena, the mother of the first Christian Roman Emperor, Constantine. This celebration memorializes the installation of the remnants of the true cross of Jesus in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher on Mount Calvary, September 14, 335 AD.

We should honor the cross and carry it on our person to remind ourselves of the love God has for us and the price Jesus paid for our salvation. The cross will give us strength in our sufferings and remind us of our hope of eternal glory with our risen Savior. We should bless ourselves with the sign of the cross to remind ourselves that we belong to Jesus, to honor the Most Holy Trinity, and to ask God to bless us, save us and protect us from all danger and evil. Lastly, the crucifix should remind us that we are forgiven sinners and we are expected to forgive those who offend us and to ask for forgiveness whenever we offend others.

The cross of Christ is a reminder that we have our own crosses to carry. Our crosses have different sizes in the same way that we have different magnitudes of challenges in life. Nevertheless, we are called to accept our crosses and endure them in faith. We know that, like Jesus, our cross will not be the source of our end but the beginning of new life. Our cross reminds us that life is not a bed of roses. Nevertheless, it will lead us to eternal life.

As we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, let us thank God for the gift of his very life which is ours in the Church. Let us rededicate ourselves to dwell always in the Heart of God through his precious Son, our Savior. Let us embrace once again the Cross of our Savior in which alone we find our salvation.


