COMMUNITY VS MODERNITY

By nature, humans are relational and interactive beings and as such they form a community. According to Aristotle, "a human person is a social animal, whose full potential can only be realized within a community or polis." Countless researchers, and probably your own personal experience show that social connections lead to better health outcomes and a higher quality of life that improve chances of survival, whereas social isolation is linked with adverse negative health impacts such as but not limited to cognitive decline, depression and anxiety, and weakened immune function with all the consequences.

We need a Community, for it's such crucial that it answers the intrinsic hunger for personal identity, since according to Sociologists; A person becomes who they are through relationships and not by being around others. A community enables each of her members to benefit from the diverse backgrounds in terms of culture, talents and skills, and other human perspectives that form the social fabric.




