

A NOTE FROM DEACON DEV

This weekend we will be celebrating the Ascension of Christ.

The Ascension is probably the most misunderstood feast in the Church calendar. Most people think that it is the time when Jesus left us, and hopefully one day, in the distant future, he will return back to us. But that's not it at all.

The evangelist Luke ends his gospel with an account of the Ascension and he begins the book of Acts also with the Ascension. The Ascension then is the transition from Jesus' life and ministry on earth to the life and work of the Church. So, on the one hand, the Ascension brings to a close Jesus' public ministry on earth. What had begun with the annunciation to Mary now comes to a conclusion with his ascension into heaven. But, on the other hand, the Ascension is also the transition to what Jesus continues to do, but not now in his historical body, but in his mystical body, the Church.

But how is this going to happen? How would the apostles be able to continue the ministry of Jesus? Through the promise, presence, and power of the Holy Spirit. And so, why did Jesus go up? So that the Holy Spirit could come down. It is through the Spirit in the Church that Jesus directs the work of the Church. Jesus' last words to his apostles before he ascended were: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Brothers and sisters, through our baptism, we have been given the same calling as the apostles. We received the same Holy Spirit at Baptism, and the power and the gifts of the Spirit at Confirmation. And so, like the apostles of Jesus, we too can be his witnesses beginning wherever we are, wherever our Jerusalem is, whether it is here in Apex or elsewhere, and then to the ends of the earth.

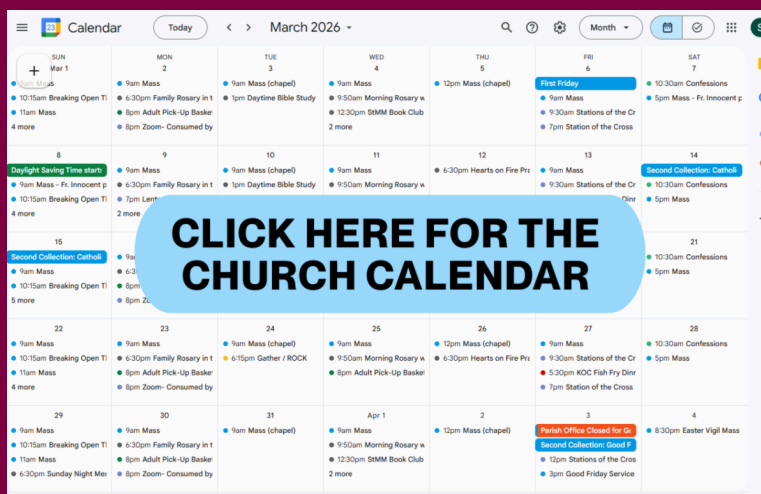

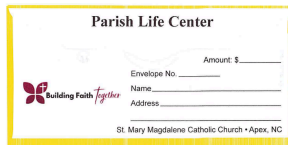
Road construction and resurfacing work will be taking place in neighborhoods surrounding St. Mary Magdalene in the coming months. This work is part of the Town of Apex's
